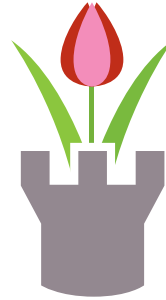

# heritage award



The Heritage Award, sponsored by the Heritage Council, seeks to promote a greater awareness of the value of heritage to our quality of life and to sustainable economic development.

With that in mind, The Heritage Council seeks to recognise projects that benefit heritage and support the community. The Heritage Council wants to support people and projects that demonstrate the value of heritage and how it connects to our lives. The project must benefit the public and an aspect of heritage as set out in the Heritage Act. These include monuments, archaeological objects, heritage objects, architectural heritage, flora, fauna, wildlife habitats, landscapes, seascapes, wrecks, geology, heritage gardens and parks and inland waterways. Benefit is understood to mean enjoyment, conservation and/or identification.



## Projects not considered

- New buildings or modern refurbishment of older buildings.
- New public or commemorative sculptures.
- Amenity works and environmental improvements. This includes works such as seating, spot-lighting, landscaping, curbing, provision of rubbish bins etc.

- Please provide a short description of your project and what its aims are.
- Does the project follow the principles of best conservation practice?
- Can you outline the community involvement?
- What are the long-term benefits of the project?
- What are the communication elements of the project?
- Is the project part of a management plan or generally well thought out?
- Please be sure to include 3-4 photographs of the project and clip or staple the photos to the application form. Maps locating the project are especially welcomed where relevant.

Entries should be forwarded to the **TidyTowns Unit, Government offices, Ballina, Co Mayo.**

Closing date for entries is **25th May 2017**. All entries will be assessed by a panel of judges appointed by The Heritage Council.
